Unit codes for GCSE (Double Award) in vocational subjects start with a 5 and may be found in parts 6 and 10 of this section. Units taken on previous occasions should not be entered unless they are being retaken. Entries for coursework (portfolio) units should be submitted in the relevant examination series. Fees will be charged per unit entry.
